THE ATISHA CHARITABLE TRUST (ACT) REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2020

The Atisha Charitable Trust is a spiritual, educational and philanthropic organisation established to provide impetus to its stated motto. It has now completed 27 years since its founding. The Trust also happens to be the only establishment following the Ganden Oral Transmission lineage of Mahayana Mantrayana Buddhist tradition and pioneers integration and service to its mainstream society—in this case, the Indian society.

The ACT's cherished goal has been the upkeep of its main project, the Kundeling Monastery. The Trust hopes to achieve all of its objectives by creating an ideal community, as mentioned earlier. Taskforce to attain social projects in the years has been and is conducted with the active participation of the community of the Kundeling Monastery, even today.

We have since the year 2000 been providing a general report of our significant projects as Newsletters. We do, however, hope to be able to put up our website in the future, now that the conditions to it are available. Until then, we hope that our patrons and friends will bear with us for the time when it is ready.

YEARLY PROJECTS INVOLVED

As per our early reports, our 'Annual Engagements' follow the same pattern, only except for a new project undertaken. According to the calendar for easy understanding, we would like to enlist them:

Annual Paricharya Engagements—month-long engagements of religious rites for Peace, pacification of diseases and natural disasters and progress. **The Kundeling Monastery** and its maintenance involving; the community's sustenance, educational and well-being programmes. **The Free Medical Camps Services** in the village and **Chinese Medical Camp Service**, within the headquarters of the ACT and **Sponsorship Schemes** for Monastics, the Schools and eligible Villagers.

Projects are not necessarily restricted to the said list as mentioned. There are opportunities or avenues of help that are offered that are compatible with our by-laws. Such has been embarked on frequently in the past, mentioned in our reports earlier.

WHAT THE PROJECT PARICHARYA INVOLVES

The Kundeling Monastery is a spiritual and monastic community. It is hence incumbent for the Trust to begin the year with activities requiring ritual involvement and prayers. The engagement in acts of the accumulation of merit is a sacred binding obligation at large for all



Buddhists. A unique team of monks invited to the ACT headquarters resides for a month or less as its guests. During this period, a long list of rites from the catalogue of rituals known to the Gelugpa curriculum is performed.

As hosts to monks, the business of catering to all their basic needs, asides from the accommodation, recreation and stipends—which in the Buddhist tradition is an 'Offering', is considered a means to acquire merit. It is an age-



old practice honoured and is vital to Buddhists, wherever they are. This year too. In a practical sense, monks voluntarily abandon the pursuit of a livelihood. Hence, their sustenance and basic needs come from Buddhist patrons and the monetary contributions they receive from donors.

For the reasons stated before, ritual engagement becomes a period of intense activities requiring sufficient preparation, infrastructure, artistic skills and work. The practice began with what is called 'The Torma Making,' the yearly offerings before the onset of the rituals. Preparations would commence on 4th November and conclude with the patterns on 29th December.

FREE MEDICAL CAMP SERVICES
